
Join me in NEW ORLEANS IN SEPTEMBER! I am honored to be teaching for PAINTSPACE NOLA Sept14-16, 2023.

I teach my weekly pastel classes at the Cameron Art Museum and do demos and private students via Zoom!






I teach my weekly classes at the Cameron Art Museum as well as demos for national societies via zoom.

The recipients are always touched deeply by having a custom portrait of their dogs.











Finding my Way as an Artist

Nan McCarthy, who does miniature acrylic photorealist paintings, and I had another wonderful conversation about art. We get together every week for Waffle Wednesday at Intervale Pancake House in Henniker, then come back here for more chatting. Our friendship is unique because our art mediums, styles and techniques are very different. We both mostly work in landscapes, but her goal is photorealism while I use a photo for reference and inspiration.

One of our topics this week was on the lack of training in school art classes when we were kids. We grew up in very different family dynamics and states, yet both commiserated on how we don't feel we were taught anything worthwhile. (And both wish we'd had better lessons in how to draw.) I don't ever remember being encouraged or told I did a good job in school art classes. I just remember never feeling good enough or as good as others, although I mostly received Bs for grades.

Maybe this is one of the reasons why I've always strived to find my own way. I don't want to do things exactly like others. Yes, I'm willing to pick up tips and such ...

For instance, in the last newsletter, I commented on my experience with different papers. A few weeks back, I was reading "Landscape Painting in Pastel" by Elizabeth Mowry. I was particularly intrigued in her section on "Wetting-in Technique for Fog and Mist." She described using a small amount of water on a polyfoam brush. My brain immediately ran with the idea of using that technique to see if that would solve my issues with sanded paper.

Of course, I had to finish the two paintings-in-process on the easels first. I considered the new technique but feared ruining the progress already made. And currently I'm working on my big, yearly summer guide project for the InterTown Record, so I haven't had much time for the studio. Still, I managed to finally start a new painting using this technique for the sky and background mist – and I like it! I can't wait to experiment more with this.

For the month of April, I've had eight paintings on exhibit at the Fuller Library in Hillsborough.

Next page - "Winter in Blue No. 1" and "Winter in Blue No. 2" both on 10 ½ x 16 on blue pastel board using a variety of pastel types. I did these two at the same time to have a pair – the challenge was the texture of the paper. Reference photo, courtesy of Tara Holdner.)







I'll be participating in the NHPS retreat in Jackson in June and really looking forward to it




"Day at Jackson X-Country" (above) 9x12 soft pastel on UArt 800 grit paper 2023




"Fall Birches" (above) 9x12 soft pastel on UArt 800 grit paper 2023


Waterfall Explorations

The second image (right) is from the Morse trail in Sandwich, NH.









Third place (PSNH Juried) Show (includes jury into show pt.) 3 points
Any Award (PSNH Juried) Show (includes jury into show pt.) 2 points
Juried into Annual PSNH Juried Show 1 point
Best in PSNH Members Show 1 point
Juried into another National Pastel Show 1 point
(includes Pastel Journal top 100)

Signature Member applicants must apply for Signature Membership. The applicant must keep records and send copies of all documentation of all earned points to the Vice President who will be responsible for Pastel Society of NH Signature Member record keeping.

The applicants must be members of the Pastel Society of NH while earning all points and must have served on a board position for 2 years.

Once approved, they must remain members in good standing to maintain Signature Memberships.

Benefits of Signature Members:

- May use the initials "NHPSA" (NH Pastel Society Artist) on their art work, publications, and biographies as long as they remain a member in good standing.
- May organize and participate in show only for Signature Members.
- May display additional artwork on the Pastel Society of NH's website in the "Signature Circle Members" section.
- May receive a discount for application fees for all PSNH shows.

Responsibilities of Signature Members:

- Promote pastel painting, mentor and assist newer members
- Participate in a demo or presentation for a members' meeting.
- Offer critique at paint-outs or PSNH functions
- Organize and participate in Signature Members Show

The earning of points is retroactive to 2009.
